### **APOLOGIES**

### **PREVIOUS MINUTES (03 February 2022)**

### **Public Participation**

### **Police Report**

There has been an increase in noisy music calls which we have been attending, and also liaising with Glasgow City Council ASB team in relation to this.

There has been a handful of undetected housebreakings that are still being investigated.

There was 1 sexual crime within a dwelling house that is still being investigated, however police are not looking for anyone else in relation to it.

There was a male arrested for acting in a threatening manner whilst in possession of a knife. This appears to be an isolated targeted incident.

There was a significant drugs and cash seizure where by a male was arrested and released on an undertaking for drugs offences. This was in relation to a proactive stop by police.

There have been a few isolated incidents of ASB, where persons have been charged with offences such as breach of the peace, assault and vandalism.

Police continue to be proactive in road traffic matters, with several motorists being reported for no licence, no insurance, dangerous driving and drug driving.

We have been liaising with Jim Kane from the Council, regarding parking issues at Tinto primary and are looking at a joint action plan in order to tackle this issue.
